Painting and Decorating Pre-Apprenticeship Program 52443WA Certificate II in Building and Construction

MPA Skills undertakes a School Based Pre-Apprenticeship program for Plumbing and Painting with full time secondary students in year 11 or 12.

What are MPA Skills Pre-Apprenticeships in school?

Students attend school, train at MPA Skills and are linked to an employer for work placement. The student must complete a work placement as nominated in the pre-apprenticeship program. MPA Skills will coordinate work placements in partnership with the schools. Pre-Apprenticeships in schools allow students to:

- Undertake training while completing their Western Australian Certificate Education (WACE).
- Have an industry endorsed pathway to a full time apprenticeship.
- Receive credit for successful completion of units of competency.
- Receive VET credit transfer towards the WACE.

Entry into an apprenticeship may be gained during Pre-Apprenticeship training or subsequent to graduation.
